My name is Merve Slade (Shaver) and Ray was my dearest friend for 40 years and best man at my wedding. We first met on the ferry to the Isle of Man in 1967, both on our way to the TT races and remained friends ever since.

Many of you will have known Ray, who lived in Ilton all his life and will have been affected by his tragic death on the 22^{nd} October 2016.

You may have come to know Ray through Haymans Bakery where he started his working life or perhaps from running the Boys club for many years, he also maintained the machinery at the cricket club. He may well have made a cake for you as this was one of his many talents. He also played skittles for the Bell in Ilminster and worked for many years at Phoenix Engineering in Chard.

We felt it would be fitting to have a lasting tribute to Ray in the form of a memorial bench that hopefully could be placed at the cricket ground. St Peters Update

First of all, we would like to thank all of you for filling in the questionnaire featured in the last edition of Ilton Talking. It has shown us that there is a desire to keep the Church in our village and given us a positive start to form filling!

The results of the survey were as follows:

387 questionnaires were delivered

266 responded and, for one reason or another, 121 chose not to complete it. (To have a 68% response rate is excellent, according to our advisers, so we were very pleased with this.)

249 thought there should be a Church in the Village whilst 17 did not.

Of the replies we received, 177 are Christians, 18 are 'Other,' 45 have no religion and 26 preferred not to say

When asked if anyone was prepared to help with events 77 said yes and 189 said no.

When asked if anyone thought that they would possibly hire the Church should all the renovations be complete, 115 said yes whilst 151 said no.

I talked to many of you on the way around and was overwhelmed by your support. Good things are starting to happen within the Church and there is a general buzz about the project. It is a real big shame that the Church cannot survive without diversifying but, with careful planning, and helpful assistance it will remain as one of the focal points of village life - which was the essence of most conversations that I had.

As I have mentioned, elsewhere in this newsletter, an up-date will be given at the AGM but just to let you know, we now have heat in the Church!! We are extremely grateful to an anonymous donor that gave us the money to be able to carry out this project and we were even more grateful at the Carol Service, when, for the first time in years, we didn't need to rush home to completely thaw out!!!

Merryfield Hall AGM. Friday 5th May, To be held in the Hall at 7.30pm.

I know, I know – not another AGM I hear you say!! But, actually, if you do decide to go to one they can be quite interesting!! You will hear how the Hall has progressed, whether or not it is financially stable, how the Hall interacts with village life and what may be happening in the future. On top of this you can enjoy a FREE social night out, meet people that you haven't before and learn how you can become involved in village life if you want to.

As ever, and not just in this village, committee members are hard to find these days. Some people think it is an arduous job, others think their homes or personal income can be at risk if they join a committee, some think it is boring whilst others think it can be left for someone else to do. BUT, none of these are true! The job, when shared between people takes up 2-3 hours per month, if that, so there is nothing arduous about it. Gone are the days when personal income can be a worry (unless you deliberately fiddle the books!) and the other members of the committee plus insurance cover means that no-one's money is at risk. The job is far from boring – it is social, it enables you to make friends and lets you make a difference in villagers' lives knowing you are helping to run a much-needed community resource. Finally, if we all left it for someone else to do then there would be no community facilities for us to enjoy.

So please join us on this evening, come and meet friends, old and new, hear about the village Hall, enjoy some cheese and wine and decide if you can help us by joining our committee.

South Somerset residents help shape the future of the census

South Somerset has been specially selected as part of a large scale test of the census, run by the Office for National Statistics (ONS).

This is an exciting opportunity for local residents to help shape the census which will happen in 2021. Test day is 9 April 2017.

Randomly-selected households will be sent a letter beforehand with a unique access code to enable them to answer their test questionnaire online quickly and easily – it should take about 10 minutes.

There will be census officers working in the area in April and May, and online and telephone help will also be available.

Your participation is hugely valued by ONS. It will help develop an online census for 2021 that asks the right questions and gets the maximum response. The more successful the census test is in South Somerset, the more we benefit in future.

New text number to combat rural crime - 81819

The Police are launching a new text service to help prevent and detect rural crime.

You can provide information and intelligence about suspected crime in your area by texting the Rural Crime Team on 81819.

No matter how small or insignificant people may think information is, it may be a vital piece of a jigsaw that helps the Police fill in the gaps and either prevent a crime or bring offenders to justice.

The number won't be monitored 24/7 but the team will be looking at it when they are on duty, so it shouldn't be used for reporting crimes, or anything which requires an immediate police attendance. In those circumstances please dial 999.

You can still pass on information via the independent charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. They never ask your name or trace your call.
