This has been supported by our County Councillor Derek Nelson and will help make the road safer for pedestrians including the elderly and young children who use this road.

## Open Letter from St Mary and St Peter's CE VC Primary School

#### **Ilton Primary**



I have been headteacher of our school for five years and during this time the staff and governors have worked incredibly hard to ensure that there is an excellent school serving your village. This has included changing your school to include all primary age children and federating with Shepton Beauchamp CE VC Primary School. It puts us in a much stronger position to do our best for the children. You may remember that in November 2010 we had an ofsted inspection that stated we were 'good with outstanding features' and we have gone on to make many more improvements since then.

At Ilton we have two classes. Oak class is for our older children and is taught by Darren Troake. Darren is a very experienced teacher who acts as my deputy when I am not on site. In the younger class (Ash Class) we have Seb Gawen who has just joined us. It is unusual to have two male teachers in a primary and we are so lucky that they are with us as they are both outstanding teachers.

As I write this (Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> October) I am reflecting on the exciting and full day that the children have had in school. The day started with a violin lesson for Oak Class. This was taught by Helen Morgan a visiting music teacher. The children really look forward to this session and learn so much about music in general as well as learning to play an instrument. The rest of the morning was dedicated to the teaching of literacy and mathematics. As I walked around the classrooms there was a real buzz with all children engaged in their learning. I did not see any lesson that was below the grade of outstanding. Children were sorting shapes into sets, finding out about regular and irregular polygons, finding shapes in the environment, learning the sounds of letters, reading and writing and all with enthusiasm. Many of the children were being taught in small groups either by our teachers or by our teaching assistants. We have a highly skilled and dedicated team of teaching assistants who work with the children to ensure that they all make good progress. During the morning we had a visit from Father Geoff who told them a story from the bible during Collective Worship. Father Geoff visits us every Tuesday and during some weeks we also have a visit from Father Andrew.

The younger children always have a 'fruit break' in the morning. It is a good time to sit and share news and to talk about their learning. Today all the children managed to get out to play even though it was a wet day. They were all looking forward to going onto our new play equipment but it has rained since it has been completed! The new equipment has a range of activities for the children such as a slide, climbing wall, fireman's pole and a bridge.

A full afternoon followed the lunchtime with the older children learning Spanish and then finding out about another religion. (Yesterday, they were designing boats and then seeing if they would float- this was linked to their topic of pirates). In the younger class they were also learning about another religion and then had a science lesson sorting pictures of animals into different set linking to their topic of the farm. During the afternoon we had a visit from Angela Johnson who is one of our school governors. Angela spent the afternoon in the library listening to children read and talking to the children about their books. Both classes finished the afternoon with a story. However, that does not always mean the end of the school day. The children can stay to an after school club – At Ilton we run cheerleading and a stay and play club. Our children can also attend the book, drama or sewing club at Barrington or the sewing, zumbatonic or football club at Shepton. We will shortly be running a film club. The children do get a wide choice of activities.

I would like to say this is a fairly typical day but all days differ. The children enjoy a variety of PE, art, history geography lessons etc. However, the favourite seems to be Forest School. In this session the children learn to work with each other, become a team and develop good social skills. The lessons depend on the seasons and recently the children have been blackberry picking and one group made some delicious jam. On another day they may create home for insects, plant trees or flowers or look at life cycles of insects.

Looking ahead Ash Class are going to Coombe Farm for the day and have invited the children from Merryfield pre-school to join them. Oak Class are going to the theatre in Bristol to see The Lion King. They are really looking forward to this trip. In addition we have arranged two of the make up artists from the theatre to visit the children in school. Ash Class are also going to Bristol Zoo for a day in November.

Last week we held our Harvest Festival in St Peter's Church. The children sang beautifully as usual and are getting much better at speaking in public. We are having our Christingle Service on 3<sup>rd</sup> December at 9.00a.m. and our Carol service at 11.00a.m. on 21<sup>st</sup> December. Why don't you come along?

As a village you should be pleased that you have a thriving village school. Please come and visit us, I would be more than happy to show you around. Please contact me on 01460 52574. If I am not there someone will pass on the message. I am sure you will be surprised at what you see so please let everyone know how good we are. We would also be pleased to hear from anyone who can come in and help. Maybe you could hear children read, help them bake or play games with them. If you would like to support our school why don't you consider becoming a school governor? Give me a ring and I can explain what this would entail.

Please support your village school. The children are delightful, the staff hardworking and dedicated and our curriculum exciting and engaging. All our children are making good progress and they would love you to come and look at their work.

## **NEWS from PC Toni Lines**

#### **Recording your Property**

The following advice may help the police to recover your property if you are unfortunate enough to suffer from burglary.

#### **Photographs**

- Photograph each item individually and as close-up as possible
- Place a ruler under each item to indicate the size
- Always take more than one photograph. Also with larger items take photographs at different angles
- Photograph the position of any maker's marks, damage or repairs
- Take photographs of your rooms and displays so that if items are stolen it will remind you of what has been taken
- Photograph in natural daylight; if using a flash avoid reflections

#### **Protection**

- Make sure you are adequately insured
- Obtain valuations with descriptions by a reputable antique dealer or auctioneer if you can afford it
- Keep receipts of recent purchases
- Remember your photographs and descriptions help to prove to your insurance company that your treasures are antiques
- Make a written inventory of your antiques with descriptions and measurements, either on the back of the photographs or in separate note books etc.

# **DOG MESS**

There have been a large number of complaints about the amount of dog mess around the village that appears to be getting worse. This also includes reports of bags of dog mess being thrown into trees and hedges. Although the majority of dog owners are behaving responsibly by bagging and binning, the mess on the pavements indicate that there are some who are not.

There are a number of dog bins around the village which are emptied regularly by the council. These can be found near Spurwells, Merryfield lane, Rod lane and near the cemetery.

The Councils dog warden has been contacted about the problem and has put up signs around the village to remind dog owners of their responsibility. Extra patrols will also be made to monitor the situation.

Failure to clean up after your dog is a criminal offence. Anyone observed by the dog warden failing to clear up after their dog will be served with a fixed penalty notice or reported for a potential prosecution. If you are aware of specific individuals allowing their dog(s) to foul, please report them to the dog warden by calling 01935 462462.

## Areas of responsibility and useful numbers

Ther have been a number of questions raised recently about areas of responsibility for repairs around the village and who problems should be reported to.

The following is intended as a guide to try and help.

The Parish Council has responsibility for some of the grass cutting around the village including the Recreation Ground, Church yard, Cemetery, Village Green. Also the recreation ground itself and Brook Common. Any issues with these areas can be reported to the Parish Clerk Sue Morley on 53378.

# **Fly Tipping**

Fly tipping is on the increase around Ilton with rubbish being illegally dumped in areas such as Brook Common, The old railway halt and Frost lane among others.

People are being warned by South Somerset District Council to check out exactly where their waste is going if they pay a handyperson or company to take it away, or potentially face a fine of up to £5,000.

If you do employ someone to take your waste away you must make sure that they have a 'waste carrier's number'. You can call on the Environment Agency on 08708 506506 or visit their website.

Potentially if you don't check that they are authorised and they then dump your waste illegally, you could be found liable to a fine or a criminal record under fly tipping legislation.

Flytippers could be liable to a fine of up to £50,000, imprisonment and a criminal record. If caught

#### INFORMATION FOR HIRERS OF THE HALL

#### **BOOKING DEPOSITS**

As agreed at the Trustees meeting on 25th April, new arrangements will take effect from Monday, 7th May 2012 requiring hirers to lodge a deposit of £20 (twenty pounds) with the Booking Secretary at the time of making a one-off booking, or series of bookings, to hire the Hall.

This principle was advertised in 'Ilton Talking' of October 2011, as well as other requirements to ensure the Hall is left neat and tidy.

A booking **will NOT be secured** until the deposit has been received.

This means that, if proposed bookings clash, the first to pay the deposit will secure the booking.

The deposit can be cash, or preferably a cheque made payable to Merryfield Hall, which will be handed back to the hirer once the Hall has been left undamaged, clean and tidy.

For bookings already made it would be advisable to lodge the deposit with the Hall committee as soon as possible.
