DOG MESS

There have been a large number of complaints about the amount of dog mess around the village that appears to be getting worse. This also includes reports of bags of dog mess being thrown into trees and hedges. Although the majority of dog owners are behaving responsibly by bagging and binning, the mess on the pavements indicate that there are some who are not.

There are a number of dog bins around the village which are emptied regularly by the council. These can be found near Spurwells, Merryfield lane, Rod lane and near the cemetery. A new bin has been provided in Copse Lane.

The Parish Council requests that due to the obvious health hazards associated with dog mess that dogs are not taken into the Village recreation field and the Cemetery near the School. Also there has been an increase in the amount of dog mess in the Churchyard recently. This is a public footpath so dogs cannot be banned, but owners still have a responsibility to pick up the mess and either put it in the dog bins provided around the village or take it home. Please do not decorate the trees and hedgerows with bags of poo.

The Councils dog warden has been contacted about the problem and has put up signs around the village to remind dog owners of their responsibility. Extra patrols will also be made to monitor the situation.

Failure to clean up after your dog is a criminal offence. Anyone observed by the dog warden failing to clear up after their dog will be served with a fixed penalty notice or reported for a potential prosecution. If you are aware of specific individuals allowing their dog(s) to foul, please report them to the dog warden by calling 01935 462462.

Areas of responsibility and useful numbers

Ther have been a number of questions raised recently about areas of responsibility for repairs around the village and who problems should be reported to.

The following is intended as a guide to try and help.

The Parish Council has responsibility for some of the grass cutting around the village including the Recreation Ground, Church yard, Cemetery, Village Green. Also the recreation ground itself and Brook Common. Any issues with these areas can be reported to the Parish Clerk Sue Morley on 53378.

Fly Tipping

Fly tipping is on the increase around Ilton with rubbish being illegally dumped in areas such as Brook Common, The old railway halt and Frost lane among others.

People are being warned by South Somerset District Council to check out exactly where their waste is going if they pay a handyperson or company to take it away, or potentially face a fine of up to £5,000.

If you do employ someone to take your waste away you must make sure that they have a 'waste carrier's number'. You can call on the Environment Agency on 08708 506506 or visit their website.

Potentially if you don't check that they are authorised and they then dump your waste illegally, you could be found liable to a fine or a criminal record under fly tipping legislation.

Flytippers could be liable to a fine of up to £50,000, imprisonment and a criminal record. If caught

Churchyard

Our Churchyard is what is known as a "Closed Churchyard." In 1956 it was noted that there was no longer any room for burials to take place within our Church grounds. When this happens, the responsibility for it, and any other cemetry opened in the village, falls upon the Parish Council. The cutting of the grass, positioning of headstones, footpaths, falling debris, state of the trees etc all become a part of the Parish Councils' remit. We do try to help when we can by organising 'Churchyard Tidy Up Days' but with fewer people than ever to call on for this type of work it is becoming increasingly difficult and as we are trying to concentrate on the re-ordering project, the presentation and responsibility will be mostly down to the parish council, at least for the next two years, so if you have any queries or concerns please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council on 01460 - 53378 in the first instance.

Bank Holiday History Walks

Are you interested in Iltons history? Want to know some information about some of the local sites and properties? Well then, May is the month for you!! I will be doing 4 walks around our village where we can look at old photographs and so compare the old and the new scenes, and as we travel along the routes I can relate any historical information that I've picked up over the years. Each walk is £2.50 per person with maximum numbers of 12. Walks are approx 2 hours each of which you will be walking, or standing, the whole time and whilst everyone is welcome please understand that you come at your own risk.

Friday 2nd May, starting at 10.30pm, Village Green - Wadhams Castle

This walk is the oldest part of Ilton. We will start on the green (opposite the pub) and walk down to Merryfield Lane taking in the old school houses, Drakes Farm, The Wyndham Arms, Ilton Court, The Old Chapel and the former Post Office. Then we shall proceed up Merryfield Lane taking in the Wadhams Almshouses and finally going onto the site of Merryfield House (Wadhams Castle), home to the Wadham family who founded a college at Oxford.

Saturday 3rd May, starting at 2.30pm, Frost Lane - Ilford

Starting at the top of Frost Lane we'll take in the pretty cottages in this area before continuing out through Rod Lane. From Rod Lane we'll go on to Brook Green and then finally take the road around to Ilford - a hamlet of Ilton with 9 houses.

Sunday 4th May, starting at 2.30pm, Cottage Corner - Ashford

We will start opposite the corner of Frost Lane on the main road through the village and take in Cottage Corner, Penny's Meade, Hillview Close, St Peters Close, 3 main farms associated with Ilton, the airfield, (views only!), and finally onto Ashford - another hamlet of Ilton.

Monday 20th May, starting at 2.30pm, Cad Road - Old Way

Essentially this road for the best part of Iltons history was the industrial part of Ilton. Village life up until the early 1900's existed along this road with farmers, wheelwrights, blacksmiths, butchers, shops, glovers and more. We will start at the lay-by right at the start of the village and walk straight to the other end where the old toll gate used to be.

Flooding: Old Railway Bridge Site

Following a long campaign, the County Council have finally agreed improvements to the drainage system at the site of the old railway bridge which will include new drainage pipes under the road. This should reduce the risk of flooding at this location in the future. Unfortunately the work will require the road to be closed while the pipes are laid, but due to the ongoing issues at Cemetery/New road in Ilminster work will be delayed until that problem is resolved and reopened again.

Following the recent wet winter it was vital that anyone who had responsibility on their land to keep waterways and ditches clear ensured this was done. Apart from the difficulty of getting around, flooding causes misery for those people whose homes are affected by it. There were also problems caused by blocked road drains. The tea parties take place once a month on a Sunday Afternoon, and they give lonely isolated elderly men and women a chance to enjoy others company. Can you spare a little time! Regrettably I have been informed of a scam that is currently being used in Somerset where a message is left on your answer phone requesting that you call back either regarding someone you know or that you have won a cash prize. If the area code is either 0809, 0284 or 0876 from the UK you are advised not to call it as the 0809 code is located in the Dominican Republic. You will be put through to a long recorded message at a very high call-charge rate.

I would also like to draw your attention to the Think Jessica campaign (www.thinkjessica.com) which is aimed at stopping Mass Marketing Fraud. There is an increase in lottery and prize draw scams where you are asked to send money in order to claim a prize. Some elderly and vulnerable people are receiving over 100 scam letters a day, in fact twenty pensioners in Devon were tricked into sending £350,000 to claim a non-existent prize draw windfall. If you are worried that you are receiving scam letters then please contact me.

Also, if anyone is worried about the cost of their energy bills, please call me to see if you are eligible for an Extra Winter Fuel grant.
